

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

Throughout the year the Investment Committee has met to review quarterly returns, recommend investment changes/adjustments, and to interview investment managers. During the year the Committee added two investment advisors and removed one investment group in the long-term investment pool, bringing the total of long-term pool advisors to four, effective July 1, 2017. The long-term pool is currently invested with Bruce Brugler of Tiedemann Wealth Management, John Boyd of Edward Jones, Craig Libler of Charles Schwab and Ray Gonzalez of Wells Fargo Advisors.

What's New

During the last few years the Foundation staff and board have been conducting research regarding investing some of the long-term investments in our region. Impacting investing has been gaining traction nationwide as Community Foundations leverage more impact from charitable dollars by looking for mission related investments. A concern of the Community Foundation of Western Nevada is the availability of affordable workforce housing in our region. A community development financial institution (CDFI) is a financial institution that provides credit and financial services to underserved markets and populations locally. Our first impact investment is through the Idaho-Nevada CDFI. While we are investing in a pool, the CDFI is currently financing a Reno project. Hillside Meadows, near Virginia Lake, provides 44 units of affordable family housing with a preference for working veterans. The Community Foundation invested \$500,000 in the financing of the \$10.2 million project through our local CDFI. Our investment provides a fixed rate of return of 3%. Total participation by CDFI investors is \$750,000.

The Community Foundation's Investment Policy sets allowable ranges for asset categories for investments pools.


Investment Pool	Investment Horizon	Description
Long term growth	8 years or more	Diversified portfolio of global stocks and bonds 62% equities, 33% fixed income, 5% other.
Long-term with Impact	8 years or more	Diversified portfolio of global stocks and bonds from companies with strong financial and social records. 62% equity, 30% fixed income, 5% alternatives, 3% impact
Intermediate	3 to 8 years	Diversified portfolio of global stocks and bonds 50% equities, 40% fixed, 10% other
Short-term	1 to 3 years	Portfolio of U.S. short term and global bonds 100% U.S. and global fixed income
Cash	1 year or less	Portfolio of liquid, short-term securities 100% money market securities and certificates of deposit.
